Code of Conduct for Members and Guests

City of Cambridge Cricket Club (here after known as CCCC) is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its members. CCCC believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents, carers or guardians associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others.

Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with, the club's Welfare Officer.

As a member of CCCC, you are expected to abide by the following Code of Conduct:

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, disability, race, cultural background, religion or sexuality of sexual identity.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit – including the required protective equipment – for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.
- Members must pay any fees for registration, matches, training or events promptly.
- Members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
